

The European Union is competing in the Parliamentary Rugby World Cup – the first time the EU competes in an international tournament.

What's the Parliamentary Rugby World Cup?

Since 1995 an international rugby tournament for Members of parliaments from around the world was organised ahead of the official Rugby World Cup championship. Since, the Parliamentary Rugby World Cup (PRWC) has been held every four years. This year, it'll be held in France.



A little history

The year 1995 marked a turning point in the history of parliamentary competitions with the first Parliamentary Rugby World Cup, held in South Africa. This competition, presided over by Nelson Mandela, brought together England, Australia, Ireland, New Zealand, South Africa, France, as well as a team representing the "rest of the world."

In 1999, the second Parliamentary Rugby World Cup took place in England and Wales. It included six teams: England, Ireland, South Africa, New Zealand, Japan, and France. In 2003, the third Parliamentary Rugby World Cup was held in Australia, with the host country being joined by Ireland, South Africa, New Zealand, England, and France.

In 2007, France hosted the Parliamentary World Cup, in which Argentina participated for the first time. In 2011, in New Zealand played host, while England hosted the next World Cup in 2015.

In 2023, the Parliamentary Rugby World Cup will take place in France in the first week of September. Europe's team will compete alongside parliamentary teams hailing from France, England, Ireland, Japan, South Africa, Argentina, Australia, and New Zealand for the cup.

Who are we?

The European Parliament Rugby Team – EPXV for short – is composed of Members of the European Parliament (MEPs) and EP staff, but also open to all of the EU's institutions, as well as to organisations with bona fide dealings in EU Affairs.

Our mission is, on the one hand, to facilitate, develop, and promote the practice of rugby within the EP, European Institutions, and EU Agencies. On the other hand, it is to promote the European Parliament and more generally the EU in national parliamentary rugby circles.

Founding MEPs include Éric Andrieu, Pascal Durand, Radan Kanev, Anne-Sophie Pelletier, Irène Tolleret, Mohammad Chahim and Petar Vitanov.

The team has also been endorsed by the European Parliament's President, Roberta Metsola. The team itself has two co-presidents: Éric Andrieu MEP and Anne-Sophie Pelletier MEP, while the captainship is held by Pascal Durant MEP.

So far, EPVX has played friendly matches against the French parliamentary team, against Boitsfort, a local Brussels club – also where EPXV trains every other Monday, and against the Japanese Diplomatic Rugby team. This match took place at the Belgian national rugby stadium.

Off the pitch

EPXV continues to look for rugby enthusiasts to debate the trends, future, and sustainability of this beautiful sport, in line with EU values of diversity, inclusivity, and solidarity. at our annual "State of the Rugby" conference.

The team has also organised a number of events and conferences within the European Parliament, such as a press conference featuring the team's Presidents, Anne-Sophie Pelletier and Éric Andrieu, alongside EP President Roberta Metsola, a photo exhibition, and a conference focusing on the importance of rugby's values and safety in sport.

EPXV fixtures & other activities

The tour

EPXV's tour begins on 31 August, when the team will travel from Brussels to **Toulouse** for the first leg. Ernest Wallon Stadium will play host to the first set of PRWC matches. From there, the team will go on to play its next match in **Sarlat** at Sarlat Périgord Athletic Club Rugby Stadium. The final leg of the tour will take place in **Paris** at the Stade de la Faisanderie.



While the match dates are known (marked above by the black rugby ball), precise fixtures will be announced on 1 September.

Training session with RUBieS

On Friday 1 September, EPXV will train at Blagnac Rugby Club alongside *RUBieS*, an association and rugby club focussed on promoting the practice of the sport, particularly rugby, for those in remission from cancer.
